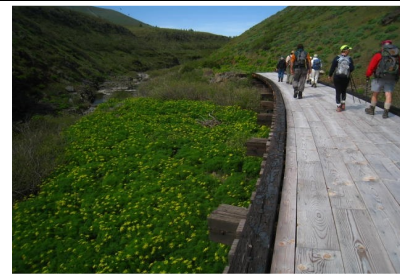


2011 Annual Conference Activities & Recreation

The Bonneville Dam

The Bonneville Dam is a must-see attraction as it spans the Columbia River and links Washington and Oregon. Visitors can experience first-hand the operation of two hydroelectric powerhouses and watch migrating fish traveling upstream at the underwater viewing rooms next to the fish ladders.
